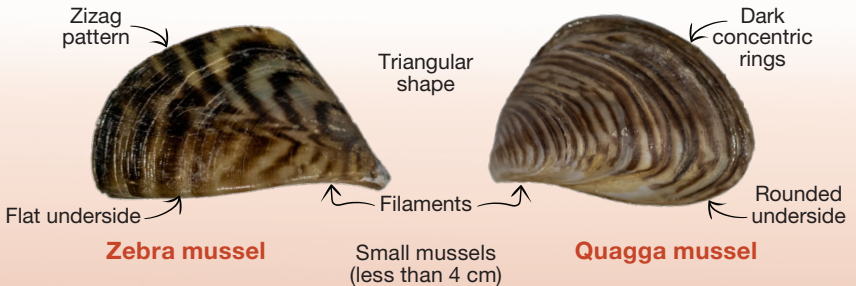




# Stop invasive mussels!

Zebra mussels and Quagga mussels threaten our native species,  
our environment and our infrastructures.

## Invasive mussels



These small invasive mussels attach to watercrafts, trailers, docks,  
rocks, plants and other mussels.

## Avoid spreading them!

## Native mussels



These mussels occur naturally in our waterbodies, do not attach,  
but bury themselves in the sediments.

## Protect them!



## Did You Know?

Invasive mussels can survive up to **30 days** out of water.

Each mussel can release up to a **million eggs** a year.

Larvae can **survive for several days** in the residual water of your watercraft and equipment.

# I'm on board!

Before and after visiting a body of water, make sure to:



## CLEAN

the interior and exterior of your watercraft, trailer, and equipment. Remove plants, animals and mud.



## DRAIN

water from internal compartments (bilge, live wells, ballast tanks) and equipment (coolers, buckets).



## DRY

watercrafts and equipment.
